Alpha lota Second Century Campaign

Thanks to those Alumni and Friends of Iota who have supported the Campaign, we have \$700,000 in contributions collected and \$100,000 in pledges and commitments scheduled for collection. While this is good progress we remain \$1MM shy of our goal.

Openly, this remaining \$1MM is the most crucial and important capital to be raised for the future of lota.

- We started the replacement of our 100 year-old heating system, but cannot complete the work unless we hit our capital goal.
- Heating system replacement will result in a return to new look for the third floor living suites and bathrooms after almost 30 years.
- We've partnered with John Ahern's I'58 company, JF Ahern Co, for the work conducted to date, and hope that you will visit the Lodge during National Convention to see the amazing results and what remains to be done.

There will still be much to accomplish at our Lodge as we begin another century under its roof: - We will need to finish the heating system replacement and complete a return to new look for the

- second floor living suites and bathrooms.
- With some urgency, we will also need to complete a lakeshore improvement project in the future.

Earlier this year we partnered with the University of Wisconsin's Civil and Environmental Engineering department that yielded some very startling results. Since 1937 we've lost 24.6 linear feet of shoreline, and the toe and crest of the bluff overlooking Lake Mendota receded by 7.7 feet and 14.8 feet respectively. This equates to an even more substantial amount of square footage already lost and has undermined the stability of the bluff slope. The study was overseen by Professor Chin H. Wu, University of Wisconsin Department of Civil & Environmental Engineering, Director Environmental/Ecological Fluid Mechanics and Coastal Sustainability Laboratory of the Limnology and Marine Science Program. Professor Wu will be giving a presentation Friday evening, July 27th, 5:00pm – 6:00pm in the Pyle Center, Room 213, in Madison at National Convention detailing the results for any Alumni in attendance.

All are very relevant and striking examples of why the time to act is now. Completing our 75 year building and property capital plan and our 25 year strategic plan - our future at Iota - is all dependent on this capital campaign – this last \$1MM we need to raise.

Many thanks to those who've contributed generously to our campaign to date, and please join us in a call to action to all remaining Alumni to secure the future for Alpha Iota.
