Our current active membership totals over 80 and is remaining consistently at that number year over year. As a result, the Lodge remains packed with nearly 40 live-ins expected this fall. Despite tremendous competition from student housing improvements in Madison, our undergraduate Brothers continue to be drawn to the unique experience of living in the Lodge that so many of us remember so fondly. This spring, they hosted a first class philanthropy event raising over \$12,000 for Gio's Garden at the 3rd Annual Purple and Gold Dinner.
