Message from ICPA President

As I embark upon a new role within our alumni group, I wanted to take the chance to outline a few priorities I see for the Iota Court Preservation association over the remainder of this year and into 2018.

My first priority is making sure we are able to reach out to every living alumnus and can provide meaningful updates on how things are going at the Lodge. We began this journey by pulling together a variety of different e-mail lists and declared one single contact list as the master. We need to continue to improve that list so we developed a tree of individuals who can help us reach out to their class mates to ensure they are hearing from us on a regular basis. In the coming months, we will be reaching out to move that forward. We have already implemented a shift in our communications strategy from semiannual newsletters to more frequent snippets of updates using Constant Contact. This reduces our production burden while creating content that is more digestible in today's mobile environment. Thank you to John Horneck and Nick Najjar who have helped us transition to using our Constant Contact model. If you are not receiving those updates, please e-mail me or Nick Najjar to be added to the e-mail list.

Another top priority is closing out our Second Century Campaign. We have secured enough pledges to retire the debt and want to complete remaining fundraising and celebrate a successful conclusion to campaign 2018 National Convention. That said, we only heard from about 10% of our alumni, and I want to make sure everyone has had a chance to participate in the fundraiser. Once we have been able to finalize our contact list, we will shift all efforts to ensure participation from everyone who would like to join us. Thank you so much to those of you who have been instrumental in getting the campaign going and helping us retire the debt. For everyone else, please look to those brothers as role models and consider the legacy you would like to leave for future generations. We would love to have more participation in this campaign.

After the debt is retired, we need to establish a proactive building renovation/restoration schedule. It has been 16 years now since the completion of the most recent renovation and with the heavy traffic a building like the Lodge gets, we need to be thinking about preventive measures so we can avoid expensive "one-time" renovations. This can be avoided with proactive maintenance and a proactive schedule to keep the building modernized and refreshed. To do this, we will form of a maintenance committee to prioritize the work needed to the building and coordinate with reputable contractors to get the work done.

Lastly, I want to help ensure a successful 2018 Chi Psi National Convention. Drew Eschweiler I'06 has taken charge with heading up arrangements and coordination with the central office. The National Convention will coincide with the 140th anniversary of the Lodge and the retirement of the debt so it is important to ensure this momentous occasion allows Alpha Iota to be a showcase for the Chi Psi brotherhood. Look forward to upcoming communication with further details.

With these activities over the next 18 months, we will have our hands full but we are well supported

Join us for Tailgate Receptions This Fall



The Lodge @ 150 lota Court: A Viable Building for the Future

Dear Brothers:

From time-to-time, we receive feedback from fellow Alumni regarding whether the existing Lodge at 150 Iota Court is a viable building for the future because of its age. This is a consideration that the officers and directors of the WACP and ICPA along with experts in various fields revisit with some regularity.

Here is a brief list of the reasons that lead us to conclude that the Lodge at 150 Iota Court is the best bet for the future of Alpha Iota:

- We hired a noted architectural firm before the significant turn of the century renovation and considered the viability of the building and multiple other options. What was ultimately delivered was a Building Master Plan for renovation of the existing site and building to make it functionally relevant and keep it that way for the next 75 years.
- The new Theta Chi house on Langdon is the best comparable for what it would cost to scrap and build a new fraternity house. Theta Chi spent \$3.8M on demolition and construction. This total cost number would be 3 to 4 times more than the amount of capital we are currently seeking to raise for the 75 year plan on the existing building and property.
- Historically, Lodge maintenance and capital expenses reflect peaks and valleys caused by reactive spending due primarily to a lack of consistent funding to support disciplined spending on periodic and preventative maintenance. Achieving our current campaign goals and establishing a sizeable endowment fund will enable our organization to conduct more rigorous and regular maintenance.
- Our Lodge was rated one of the most impressive fraternity houses in the United States, and the 2nd most impressive in the Big Ten – simply said it is an irreplaceable, one of a kind building.

- Location, location, and then location. Our lakefront property, on the horseshoe bay that includes Memorial Union and the Red Gym and is two blocks from State Street and three blocks from campus, is a rare property.
- The building is a contributing property on the National Register of Historic Places, State of Wisconsin Register of Historic Places, and City of Madison Landmark #84. The building cannot be leveled by us or any potential buyer.
- The big upside of being a registered historic building and landmark is that all contributions to the Iota Court Preservation Association are tax deductible for our alumni, friends and family. Additionally, 501(c)3 status exempts us from sales tax for construction materials and the like.
- Finally, a lot of brilliant and successful Lodgers have weighed in on and invested \$1.3M through the current capital campaign on the Strategic Plan and Building Master Plan we are executing on for the building and property that has been our Lodge for over 100 years.

We welcome different points of view; particularly from our Brothers with some expertise to lend, so please do not hesitate to share your feedback and support and feel free to contact me directly.

Upcoming Capital Requirements

In support of hosting the 2018 Chi Psi National convention in Madison, WI, we are looking to have the Lodge in the best possible condition including completion of the last 3 projects on property and building Master Plan as follows: **Replace & Upgrade Heating System:** New

in-floor radiant heat for the living quarters and repair & upgrade existing system for rest of Lodge, which would allow zoning for every room.

Complete Back Landscaping: A properly landscaped and terraced back yard is essential to ensuring the hill doesn't erode to a point of being of concern to the structure. A master plan was developed and the top level of the terrace was completed but the rest needs to be done.

Complete 4th Floor Renovations: A plan exists to complete renovations of the 4th floor including study carrels, a conference room, trophy room, and the Alpha Room.
